

SPECIAL FACULTY LECTURER IN WOMEN'S AND GENDER STUDIES

LECTURER in WOMEN'S AND GENDER STUDIES: Eastern Washington University invites applications for a full-time lecturer position in the Women's and Gender Studies Program beginning in September 2009. The position is for one year, with the possibility of renewal.

RESPONSIBILITIES: Responsibilities include working and teaching within a multi-disciplinary program. Primary teaching responsibilities will be introductory courses in Women's and Gender Studies and courses in feminist theory and in candidate's areas of expertise.

QUALIFICATIONS: Master's degree in Women's Studies, Gender Studies, or other relevant discipline in the Humanities or Social Sciences is required. Candidates must demonstrate ability to teach courses that focus on intersectionality between gender, race, ethnicity and sexuality including intro to women's studies courses and feminist theory. Areas of expertise preferred include: GLBT Studies, Globalization, and/or Interpersonal/Domestic violence. Applicants should have a successful record of teaching at the college level. A strong commitment to the liberal arts, interdisciplinary education and diversity or ethnic studies is also required.
